FELLOWS' FUNDRAISING

The Fellows fundraising has been generously supported by almost 30% of Fellows and will reach its target of £400,000, a figure that looked ambitious at the start of the campaign. Your contributions are helping the Society to develop Event activities and the Young Peoples' programme and your support is gratefully recorded on these pages. The Appeal Fund remains open for Fellows who would still like to make a contribution.

PROJECT FUNDRAISING

New grants of £5m mean that the campaign to develop "partnership projects" has also reached its target. The Lloyds TSB Foundation for Scotland is supporting research into ageing; a major new award to support Innovation will be funded by the Gannochy Trust and a new series of grants from Scottish Enterprise will create an expanded programme of Enterprise Fellowships.

Project grants are strategically important to the Society, because they demonstrate its ability to make a high quality contribution to issues of importance to Scotland and also increase its profile. However the money flows directly through the Society into the projects and this means the Society still needs to create free reserves to fulfil the programme laid out in the Corporate Plan.

NEXT STEPS

The next phase of fundraising will involve THE PATRONS' CIRCLE, the aim of which is to create an eminent forum in which select companies can make a significant contribution to Realising Scotland's Excellence.

If Scotland is to maximise the opportunity of Devolution it needs to take advantage of all the talents at its disposal and develop a co-ordinated approach to the key economic and social issues that affect the country.

The RSE is in a pivotal position. Its impartiality, independence and quality of output are acknowledged. Its ability to bring together key elements of the nation creates the opportunity for the Patrons' Circle to become a significant contributor to issues important to the well-being of all in Scotland.

The support of major organisations will be an investment in Scotland's future and enable the Society to:

- Bring together key people in Industry, Academia and Government to develop thinking on areas of mutual concern.
- Act as an independent forum and focus minds on issues of importance to Scotland, the UK and



internationally; stimulating new thinking and inspiring new initiatives.

- Increase the output of impartial, independent expert opinion for use in public and private sector policy making.
- Develop programmes of Research and Debate that will contribute to the realisation of Scotland's economic, social and cultural potential and address ways in which the societal needs of Scotland can best be met.

The Society looks forward to pursuing these objectives under the presidency of Lord Sutherland and would like to thank Sir William Stewart for his initiative which brought this campaign into being.
