Forensic anthropology examines the whole basis of human identification. Who are you and how can you prove that you are who you say you are? If something happens to you, how can we prove your identity to allow you to be returned to family? How can we prove who you are so that we can prosecute you for a crime? Identity theft and identity fraud are the fastest growing crimes in the western world and we will all be subject to this at some point throughout our life.
